The Hauptwerk Virtual Organ

The Hauptwerk virtual organ is computer-driven and composed of individual components, ably ordered and installed by Francois Ratte of Quebec City in Canada. Through the marvel of digital recordings of pipe organs all over the world, 4 organ software packages were downloaded to the computer which resides inside our organ console: a 1721 Dutch organ from the city of Zwolle, an 1885 French organ from the city of Caen, the 1892 organ in England's Hereford Cathedral and a 1973 organ residing in the Laurens-kirk in Rotterdam.

God has richly blessed the worship and musical life of our church with the funding of this marvelous instrument through the gifts of many donors, beginning with gifts in memory of Jane MacNutt, who gave long years of wonderful service to this church, especially in the Ministry of Music. Gifts from other church members and groups followed. The funding was completed with a generous gift from Jules Plangere in memory of his mother. Our church is deeply grateful to all its organ fund donors.

May God grant this instrument many years of faithful service, leading God's people in worship and bringing joy to all who hear and are inspired by it both in worship and in concerts.
