## David's Page

Transitions are a pain in the neck. I went through adolescence. I remember not understanding what was happening to my body or my emotions. I remember wanting to be treated like an adult and not having a clue what that meant. I remember being scared to death of girls, teachers, girls, other boys, tripping over myself (which I did with great regularity), spilling things (which I did with great regularity), acting like a doof, getting bad grades, getting good grades, girls, and almost everything that happened most of the time. I was in transition. I was too young to be old and too old to be young.

When I emerged from the teens, I thought I was done with such craziness. Adults don't go through transitions, do they? Well, guess what? Yup. And not only people, but everything does. The longer we live the more apparent it becomes that one of the hard truths of life is 'Things change.' There are times that are less intense than others, moments when it's almost calm, lulls in the onward rush of reality. It seems in those times we've come to the end of the changes, we get a chance to settle things down. We even get good at it. And then something pops up that doesn't fit, isn't in the rule book. And no matter how we try we can't get it to settle down or leave us alone. And we're back into it, another transition.

The hard truth remains. Even if it seemed like things were stable, change was happening, creeping up on us. Now we've got to catch up. If we insist on sticking with what worked then, we merely get further behind. Sooner or later we're going to have to figure out what's next and how to deal with it.

Here we are, a community in transition. And just like teenagers, many of us feel awkward, not knowing quite how to manage the new energies and issues that confront us. We're too little to be big and too big to be little. And there's no parking. Who's in my pew? Who are those people giving speeches?

Recently, I have come to believe more strongly than ever, that 'The Lord will provide.' We are called to be responsible. We are called to be faithful. And we are called to remember that as we go forward in this new day, the Lord will not only provide enough for us to survive, but miracles of plenty that will bring us to new visions and new ministries.

But you couldn't pay me to go back to Jr. High.

Thank you all for a truly amazing year of caring! Last October 17th, on a beautiful fall day, we gathered at RB Regional High School to put our

steps together to raise funds for hungry neighbors - our 17 local partners here in New Jersey - and our global partners around the world. It was awesome to see the 11,000 pounds of food come in bit by bit, to be shared with food pantries within hours.. Just think back

3 years ago when we brought in 4300 pounds. Look where we have gone! And we are headed back up again, raising over \$120,000 to be shared locally and globally. (\$12,000 online giving) And many helpers made everything run smoothly. THANK YOU ALL for the courage, the brains, and the heart to do this!!!

Five days after Crop Walk #30, George and I left for China, where we had the wonderful opportunity to meet with Amity Foundation, our global partner in China with 25 years of service. 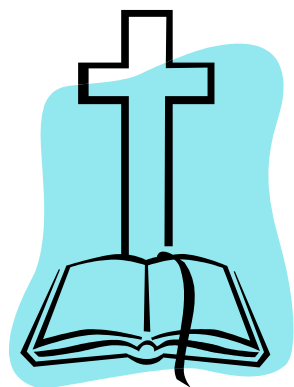
