Lighting of the Advent Candles

Leader: The Word of the Lord from Isaiah 40:9-11

“Get you up to a high mountain, O Zion, herald of good tidings; lift up your voice with strength, O Jerusalem, herald of good tidings, lift it up, do not fear; say to the cities of Judah, “Here is your God!” See, the Lord God comes with might, and his arm rules for him; his reward is with him, and his recompense before him. He will feed his flock like a shepherd; he will gather the lambs in his arms, and carry them in his bosom, and gently lead the mother sheep.”

Let us pray: Advent God, we light three candles as we journey deeper into our hope for the Messiah. In these darkest days of the year, visit us through your messengers who bring good tidings to ordinary people. Amen.
