

Call to Confession

Leader: Jesus comes into the world for a reason. We need saving. We pray together, naming today's reason for why we need a Savior.

Prayer of Confession (unison):

Living God, God Incarnate,

As we light the candle today longing for love, we recall that you teach us to love on three fronts: to love you, to love others, and to love ourselves. Those instructions seem so universal, and so

agreeable, and yet somehow we keep breaking hearts, judging others with hatred, acting out in fear. We are inconsiderate of your role in our lives, inattentive to your presence. We can't escape our own self-criticism, struggling to accept the truth that we are made in your divine image. As we behold the light of your love in the candle before us, envelop us in its glow. Show us now how you practice what you teach: how you love yourself, love us, and love all. Forgive us when we depart from the ways of love. Call us back into your love.

Moment for Silent Reflection

Assurance of Pardon (From 1 John 4:9-10, 14, 16).

Leader: God's love is revealed to us in this way: God sends his only Son into the world that we might live through him. God sends his only Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. God sends his only Son as the Savior of the world.

People: When he is revealed, we will be like him, for we will see him as he is. So we will know and believe the love that God has for us.






