Lighting of the Advent Candles

We light these candles to be reminded of what we have prepared for these past Advent weeks. With the prophet Isaiah, we join in God's vision for a kingdom where hope, peace, joy, and love prevail and we look to welcome the one anointed to lead us into it. We light these candles to kindle our anticipation as the time arrives to welcome Jesus Christ, Savior of the world.
